Leadership Day (Year 5s and 6s)

On Wednesday 1st May 2024, the Year 5 and 6 students headed to Panton Hill Primary School to take part in a Leadership Day to learn and build skills in being leaders. There were multiple schools from the region attending and the STAPS students joined in with other schools to take part in activities that would give them more skills in being leaders in our school community. The activities were: Initiative games, Public Speaking, Problem Solving, and Running a Project. At the end of the day, Golden Guitar winner Andrew Swift talked about his journey and the leadership he has displayed during his career and then played a number of tunes including his hit single "Head full of honey".

This was an incredible opportunity for our students to build these skills ready for high school as well as throughout their life journey.





STEM Summary

These first two weeks of term 2 we have explored the **nature of food and fibre**. In the Juniorsthis has meant exploring what food is for, it's role in our bodies and how it can impact our energy and mood. We found out that different foods are crucial to different areas of the body. We then explored the types of foods that were good for the different and vital organs of our bodies. In the Seniors we have investigated how food is produced, what *food miles* are and how we can have food travel either very far or not far at all to us. We then used maps to calculate how great or small these distances are, and practiced our research skills to arrive at the data we were interested in.

Juniors exploring Place Value

Place Value - understanding numbers and our base ten number system is one of the *Big Ideas in Mathematics* we explore in the first 3 years of school. Our **Junior Learning Community** has been exploring making and naming and comparing numbers, with some students working on numbers to 20 and beyond, others working towards 120 and our Year 2s working on both 2 and 3-digit numbers.









Term 2 and Great Journeys

During Term 2 our Integrated Learning focuses on Great Journeys – including Journeying through time and exploring journeys undertaken through history and now – by civilisations, explorers and migrants and refugees.

We began by exploring items from the past, and the Junior Learning Community are continuing to explore *Past and Present*, whilst our Senior Learning Community are thinking about *journeying around our world*.

In **Literacy**, in Term 2 we are exploring *Information Texts and Reports* in Reading and Writing, and will also explore retelling stories through personal narratives. We continue to build our sound/letter understandings for Reading, Writing and Spelling through *Little Learners Love Literacy* in the Juniors and *Soundwaves* in the Seniors.

In **Mathematics** this term we are exploring: Place Value and Addition and Subtraction, Time, Length and Perimeter, and Fractions (and Decimals).
