STEM News

In Week 4 we looked into the third R of Reduce, Reuse, Recycling - Recycling. As part of understanding recycling we had to investigate what can actually be recycled! It was interesting to see what we can and can't recycle and the misconceptions we had. In Grade 5/6 we investigated what we can actually recycle in our council and had to use our knowledge and the internet to help locate our appropriate council. We then made a presentation that would teach people about recycling and how it works! In Grade 2/3/4 we had a look at the different items that could appear in either the linear or circular economy and sorted them accordingly, helping us learn what makes an item special for the circular economy. In Grade P/1 we made recycling trucks - with a twist, they had to be able to automatically sort recycling and move independently. There was some incredible
