They have also explored numbers that are greater than, less than. Other students are consolidating their understanding of hundreds, tens, and ones for example 127 can be 1 hundred, 2 tens, 7 ones or 100+20+7 or12 tens and 7 ones.

We continue to support them through our well-being program and unpacking the STAPS values. It was wonderful meeting and chatting with you all at the Meet and Greet night and I appreciate you making the effort for the meeting as I am aware of how busy everyone is.

We experienced 'bush tucker', tasting Salt Bush, Lemon Myrtle, Warrigal Greens and River Mint, with a mix of opinions as to their tastiness. We tried our hand at ochre painting with special permission from Wurundjeri elder Uncle Bill Nicholson, using our fingers as the paintbrush and our arms as the canvas! We also got to dress up and act out the Gunai Kurnai dreaming story of Jiddelek the frog.

It was the Foundation students' first excursion and they were all so very excited! They all handled it so well, but were very tired on the ride home. We are very proud of how STAPS presented themselves on the day and a great day was had by all!

### **CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE**

Families of students attending a government or non-government school in rural/regional Victoria may be eligible for financial assistance to help them meet the cost of transporting children to and from school.

The financial assistance – known as a **conveyance allowance** – is a contribution towards transport costs and is not intended to cover the full cost of transporting children to and from school. Types of transport modes include public transport, private car and private bus.

To be eligible for a conveyance allowance, students must be of school age and:

- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from home to school and;
- live in rural and regional Victoria and attend their nearest government school/campus

The conveyance allowance is paid by the Department of Education to families via the school.

If you think your child may qualify for a conveyance allowance, please contact the school to discuss eligibility, and for further information on the application process and payment amounts. More information is also available at:




